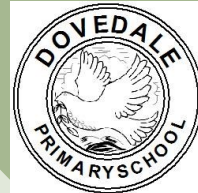


Dovedale Primary School



Dear Parents/Carers

During the spring term the children have very much enjoyed learning about Captain Robert Falcon Scott and his expeditions, making a delicious breakfast pot as part of our cookery project and our exciting trip to the World of Glass! We have another exciting term of activities planned with a trip to Formby Beach, a seaside workshop and more learning challenges in all curriculum areas.

Our topic for this term is 'Oh we do like to be beside the seaside' - What was going to the seaside like 100 years ago?

History

We will be answering lots of questions this term:

- How have seaside holidays changed over time?
- What did people do at the seaside 100 years ago?
- How do we know what seaside holidays were like in the past?

Science

Our new topic is Plants.

They will be answering the following questions using their enquiry and investigation skills:

- What is happening underground beneath our plants?
- What makes a tree, a tree?
- What wild plants can we find around us?

English

This term we will be consolidating all the skills we have learned so far in Year 1. We will begin by using 'The Lighthouse Keepers' lunch' and 'Up' to stimulate our writing. We are aiming to write with more independence and extend our creativity further.

Maths

Our focus for the summer term will be multiplication and division and time. Please practise the following skills at home:

- Addition and subtraction facts within 20
- Counting in 2's, 5's and 10's **from any given number forwards and backwards.**

PE/Clothing

Another gently reminder to ensure all clothing is labelled. This really helps us to return lost items quickly. Many thanks!

Homework

Thank you for your continued support with the half termly homework challenges. It is great to hear how much children have enjoyed completing the different activities. For the summer term, children will have a weekly Basic Skills maths sheet to complete and the weekly spelling check will continue. Please continue to send homework books back into school every **Monday**. They will be sent back home the next day.

A big thank you to those parents able to attend our Phonics Screening Check workshop. Details from the workshop have been sent home and are available on the Year 1 class page on the website.

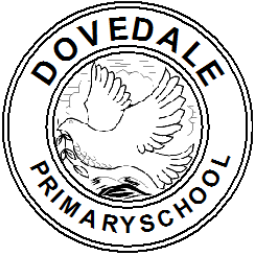

Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 1 – Summer 1

$0 + 0 = 0$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 0 = 0
$1 + 1 = 2$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 2 = 1
$2 + 2 = 4$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 4 = 2
$3 + 3 = 6$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3
$4 + 4 = 8$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 8 = 4
$5 + 5 = 10$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 10 = 5
$6 + 6 = 12$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 12 = 6
$7 + 7 = 14$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 14 = 7
$8 + 8 = 16$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 16 = 8
$9 + 9 = 18$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 18 = 9
$10 + 10 = 20$	$\frac{1}{2}$ of 20 = 10

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

Ping Pong – In this game, the parent says, "Ping," and the child replies, "Pong." Then the parent says a number and the child doubles it. For a harder version, the adult can say, "Pong." The child replies, "Ping," and then halves the next number given.
